- 8. Look at local outreach, especi ally local radio
- 9. Se an Fagan M emorial le cture with Ang ela Hanley in 2017
- 10. Write to Archbisho p Diarmuid Martin sett ing out what we would like for 2018 visit of Pop e Francis

The presidents of the Bi shop's C onferences of the world we re called t o Rome. The re they we re presented with a completed document banning the or dination of women and we re asked to endorse it in the name of the bishop s. The presidents replied that they could not speak in the name of all their members without first consulting the m. They also asked for two changes in the document: the o mission of the words 'having he and the views of the bishops' and of the word 'irreformable'. Pope John P aul llpublished Ordinatio Sacerdotalis banning women from the priestho od on 30 May 1994, the Feast Day of St Joan of Arc.



#### Irish bishops answer only to Rome – laity, priests and religious kept in the dark

On the 25<sup>th</sup> of February 2017 letters were posted addressed to each of the 29 bishops of Ireland signed by representatives of 3 organisations:

- We Are Church Ireland
- Association of Catholics In Ireland
- Association of Catholic Priests

The letters asked each bishop to publish their Ad Limina report which they had sent to Pope Francis. The Ad Limina report is a 5 yearly report to the pope about each diocese.

- · None of the 4 Archbishops (Armagh, Dublin, Cashel and Tuam) replied
- 19 bishops did not reply
- Only 6 bishops replied:
  - o Bishop William Crean of Cloyne
  - o Bishop John Fleming of Killala
  - Bishop Donal McKeown of Derry
  - Bishop Fintan Monahan of Killaloe
  - Bishop Denis Nulty of Kildare & Leighlin
  - Administrator Mgr Michael Ryan of Ossory

We thank the 6 who replied, indeed some replied in some detail, which was appreciated. But the consensus of the replies was that the Ad Limina reports are considered CONFIDENTIAL and for the pope alone. Yet Pope Francis has been calling for greater transparency and a greater involvement of the people of God in every aspect of our church. Sadly the Irish bishops behave more like managers of a multinational with all reporting going upwards.

An Australian bishop speaking at the Royal Commission made this important point:

"I think we really need to examine seriously that kind of model of Church where it promotes the superiority of the ordained and it facilitates that power imbalance between the ordained and the non-ordained, which in turn facilitates that attitude of clericalism, if you like." – Bishop Vincent Long Van Nguyen (21 February 2017)

We call on our bishops to have the courage to follow Pope Francis and engage fully with all the people of God.



This quest ion is included in the Leaving Cer tificate book "Faith Seeking Underst and ing - Religion and Gen der" (Veritas 2006). The work and prayers for the ord ination of women to all ministries by BASIC (Brother's And Sisters In Christ) is discussed a leng th. BASIC merged into We Are Church Ireland in 2012. Interestingly the book is "Printed with Ecclesiastical Approval." This open discussion about the ordination of women has been denied for adults by the institutional church. But for more than a decade this discussion has been alive in our schools! "I can understand the malaise which women feel when they see only men concelebrate. I can understand that we must look like a men's squad up at the altar."
